

Thur. 14<sup>th</sup> Apr' 27.

Although Shri continued to be indisposed with "stiff and straining" neck and head He came out of the Ghopdi and sat in the Dispensary from eight to twelve in the noon. During this time Baba allowed Darshans and interviews to the usual Thursday visitors which also included a party of "Korkinis" who were specially out in a motor lorry for pilgrimage, having already visited Sakori and Sherdi. Shri also had some stray "talks" through signs with some of the mandali, particularly in connection with the preparations that are now in full swing for opening the new Ashram on the 1<sup>st</sup>. In view of Shri's indisposition it was a very suggestive fact that Bhosseha, the blind, did not come to-day for the usual Thursday-Bhajan. After twelve o'clock Baba again retired into the Ghopdi and remained there throughout the afternoon. At about seven in the evening Shri came out of the room but took his seat on the verandha of the Ghopdi itself.

The mandali soon gathered round him but quite an unusual silence prevailed amongst

all for the following hour. About eight o'clock Kaka and family unexpectedly appeared on the scene. As they were going to Kolhapur they said they had come for Shri's Darshan. Baba conveyed He felt concerned about the time that they had selected for coming here in view of the danger from thieves and robbers, particularly since there were ladies in the party. They said it was moonlight and moreover they were coming for "Shri Guru" Darshans and hence did not fear any molestation. During some stray talk that followed Mrs Shahne asked Shri's permission for one of her family to take tea in case they were insisted upon doing so at Kolhapur against Baba's first order of not taking tea at all.

Shri granted the permission, but later conveyed to Kaka "It was a mistake to ask for changes in orders once given. An order once given was an order until withdrawn by Himself of His own accord, otherwise all should stick to it at any cost. His words must never be broken. If permission will be asked to do anything contrary to the standing order, He will never withhold refuse, but the effect of the first word and order would be gone and the party concerned would necessarily suffer".

The usual Arti was repeated by all at eight-thirty and after that for about an hour Chanting was narrated a story, and then all ~~gathered~~ were allowed to retire for the night.

Fri 15<sup>th</sup> Apr 27.

Shri Baba came out of the zopdi this morning and had His seat at first in the school and then for sometime in the Dispensary. In the noon, Shri called a meeting of the mandali, and asked someone

to read a chapter from Shri Ramkrishna Param-Hancer Life before all. The book was opened at random and the first ~~page~~ subject that greeted the eyes of the reader was about the peculiar "throat-illness" with which once Ramkrishna had suffered!

This was indeed something more than a mere coincidence, as Baba Himself has of late been suffering with a illness very like that described in the book. It was as if Baba wanted to explain His present illness through a book which He had never read! The passages were then read out.

It first described the illness with which Shri-Ramkrishna suffered at that time, and then the reason for the illness was tried to be explained.

The first of the explanation meant that the illness with which that great Master suffered was not His own. Personally Shri Ramkrishna had nothing at all to suffer for, far short of a physical indisposition. His illness, as described by His wife, was of those physically diseased, and morally debased persons who fell on His feet, and ~~as a consequence~~ that is the Master contracted the sufferings and sins of those whom He allowed to fall on His august foot. And it was for this reason that when ill, the Masters seldom took regular treatment, and even when taken in nine cases out of ten it proved of no avail. The name of Shri Ramkrishna's medical attendant which began with S. reminded all of Dr Sathe who has tried to treat Baba for this "Stiff neck" and who comes off and on for the mandali to these days since the sad demise of Dr Karpal. (Today Dr

Satthe was presented with a pearl-pen, an electro-plated feeding cup and the promise of a son being born to his wife, by Baba, for the ~~services~~ medical services so sincerely rendered by ~~to~~ him to the mandali.)

Further readings of Shri Rama Krishna's biography brought out another fact about Him which was also noticed about Baba in the past. This was, the abrupt way in which Rama Krishna used to ask for food at odd hours of the day and night and particularly when there was ~~no~~ no food ready or available!

During the stay in the "Mangil" at Dadar, Bombay, and also in the course of the following tours and tramps, as has already been narrated earlier, the same was the case with Baba. He also in the same way used to declare Himself hungry and requiring food at especially odd hours and under most unfavourable circumstances.

At four o'clock in the afternoon another meeting was convened, and the school authorities came in for a severe criticism from Baba. Chauji was the first to be "attacked". He was asked to stop henceforth all his writing and other work, and pay full-time attention to the school affairs. In the course of the following ~~as~~ 'silent' remarks Baba conveyed His great dissatisfaction and displeasure with the bad and loose management of the school affairs, and as an example pointed to such things as pieces of card-boards, chess-boards and Draught-pieces that were lying about in the school rooms. When Bhakay was asked as to what he had to say about these disorders, he said, he was much disappointed to find Shri grieved with his work who inspite of his doing the duties so very sincerely. His reply

from Shakesay was taken by Baba as if it meant that Shakesay was no longer willing to continue to work as a Principal of the school, and so Shri conveyed to others to come forward for this post including 'Champi' Vishnu Padri & Gisal. But none seemed to be willing to shoulder this responsibility, while 'Champi' put in that the man who was already on the post (Shakesay) was the best selection made by Shri and he did not mean to leave the post, and that all concerned were doing their best in carrying out the respective duties.

At these replies Baba seemed to be so much displeased that after some more discussions Shri abruptly left the meeting and ~~also~~ retired into the floordi.

After sometime Shri again sent for 'Champi' and Shakesay and continued the discussions. In view of the present state of affairs Baba conveyed to them that either the school be completely closed up or conducted without any connection from Him.

'Champi' said in that case, not only the school should ~~be~~ be closed but all other activities be stopped and the mandali be sent away to their respective places. But Baba replied that He was not going to go back on His pledge to the mandali that they will stay with Him whether there was a school or not and so let all stay even if there was no work. However after some such more discussions the matters were settled up and everything was allowed to go on as already arranged, while Shri also agreed to come in the Makan and grace the same with His inspiring presence. So after the gap of many days Baba once again came to the Makan late in evening, and all the unpleasantness ended.
