Those of the untouchable ^{male & female} villagers that had taken the oath of avoiding fish flesh & eggs seriously were distributed the promised Dholsat & Saris, ^{respectively} as a reminder of their oath by Baba. Besides ~~every~~ every boy in the school was given a new Dholsat and a Kheti coat to each of them.

Shri came to know that some of the Arangon people were going to have a 'Tamasha' in the village tonight and hence with a few of the party personally went there this afternoon. The 'leaders' of this vulgar movement were patiently lectured to and explained the disastrous result such so called amusements and Tamashes bring about in the morality of the young boys and their woman-folk by Baba who also made them be paid Rs 10/- as a compensation for the expenses that they had already undergone in this matter. Besides this Shri also arranged for the young-folk of this village to be paid Rs 13/- to enable them to have ~~small place~~ a shelter built there for them to have daily Bhajans there and thus a handsome inducement was offered them to make them attentive towards religious Bhajans instead of spoiling themselves with cheap & vulgar amusements.

The Bholaram!

The Paris Papeti holiday was duly observed here today. All were treated to Tea and Bhajias and cricket play in which Baba took a personal share.

Those of the villagers that were paid 10/- Rupees yesterday and asked not to hold a Tamasha were reported, that inspite of it all some of them did take part in such vulgar show in another village nearby. Shri seemed very angry at this but said that for the sake of a few bad ones the whole village should not be punished but he added that those who committed this breach of ~~the~~ trust would meet with a great calamity, and a couple of those residents of the colony who were suspected of having an underhand in this affair were immediately dismissed.

In the evening a Marathi boy of 22 or 23 years of age named Rama Bhira came to Shri and requested to be taken in, in the school. When cross questioned it transpired that he was a resident of Karanje near Kopergaon and upon his requesting to his father to allow him to learn sufficiently to read Ramashawari he was refused on the plea that he was sufficiently grown up to do the hereditary work of agriculture. At this the young man got dissatisfied and left the parental roof on foot to Pandharpur. He was found to have a few annas on his person and a little quantity of 'Phutane' baked rice & gram. His clothes were also found to be in rags. Shri admitted him forthwith in the colony and renamed him Bholaram. After the usual evening Bhajans Baba personally taught this Bholaram through signs the 'A.B.C' of Marathi and declared that "since coming to Arujapur he is the first to get tuition directly from me and hence whether he sticks to this place or not he will make a good progress in education inspite of his advanced age."
